Pastini Dine-Out Results: Thank you for supporting our **Pastini** Dine-Out. Our community spent a total of \$4,152.25, so Pastini will be donating 40% of that amount or **\$1,660.90 back to our school.** Way to go, Gators!

Conferences: We value the time to meet with families in partnership for your child's educational needs. Students in grades 4-8 are expected to attend their homeroom conferences. Our school conference days begin after school on Wednesday, November 1. There will be no school on Thursday and Friday, November 2nd & 3rd for conferences. Conference confirmation forms, on pink paper, of your conference day and time were sent home on Wednesday, October 25th. Please let us know immediately if you need to make any changes. If you are bringing your student(s) with you, they must be with you either in the conference or sitting in a chair in the hallway outside of the classroom. Students may not play outside during conferences without a parent directly supervising. We look forward to strengthening the partnership between home and school through our parent-teacher conferences next week.

<u>Mass</u>: This *Wednesday* our 2nd and 5th grade classes will lead us in the *All Saints' Day Mass at 1:10 PM*. Families are welcome to attend and sit behind the classes. We look forward to learning more about our amazing saints throughout the month of November.

Turkey Bingo: Our next community builder and fundraising opportunity is Turkey Bingo on November 18th. In addition to playing Bingo to win a turkey at this *adults only* event, each

family is asked to sell six \$10 raffle tickets. Packets with the raffle tickets and form to purchase admission tickets for the event will go home with the oldest student in each family next week. Bingo cards and food are included in the price of admission. Ericka Skeldon is the chair for this event and will need plenty of volunteers before, during, and after the event. Stay tuned for a volunteer sign-up next week.

Vision Screening: Our two student nurses from the University of Portland, Nurse Daniel and Nurse Abigail, conducted vision screenings with about half of our students on Tuesday. They will return to provide vision screenings for our remaining students on Tuesday, November 7th. I am impressed with some of our students' excellent vision! If we have any concerns about your child's vision during the vision screenings, we will inform your family with a follow-up letter to see your child's pediatrician.

Learning and Growing: Our preschoolers have been building their fine motor skills making creative paper pumpkins. The kindergartners have been learning about the five senses by making slime, then brainstorming adjectives such as "cold" and "goopy" to describe how slime feels. The first graders have been busy building their reading skills through Halloween picture books. The second graders created all types of bird houses while studying about what different types of birds need for home. The third graders have been learning about various types of communities. The fourth graders are tackling monster math subtraction problems to the hundred thousands place with regrouping. The fifth graders have been learning double-digit long division. Our sixth graders are learning about the structure of cells. Seventh grade students are creating graphic novel hero stories based on their reading of the Odyssey. Lastly, our eighth grade students are studying gravity and understanding mass and weight. So much learning and growing each and every day!
